

INDICATOR 2: Percent of infants and toddlers with Individualized Family Service Plans (IFSPs) who primarily receive early intervention services in the home or programs for typically developing children.

WHY DOES IT MATTER?

Early intervention activities are provided in settings where the child typically lives, learns and plays in order to ensure that the activities become a part of the child and family's typical routines, such as mealtime, bath time, play time, etc. In this way the learning opportunities for the child are maximized.
